# SPRING CITY COMMUNITY CENTER

This two story Victorian school was completed in 1899. The school housed first through eighth grades and closed in 1959. Richard C. Watkins was the architect. It was built by locally produced Strate's bricks. The school was renovated over 35 years and was rededicated May of 2017.

The city now owns the building and has moved their offices into the building. The D.U.P. Relic Collection Museum and city council chamber is located in the ground floor. The second floor is home to the ballroom. The ballroom is available to rent for weddings, parties, and etc. Office and business space is available for rent on the second floor. The third floor was previously the attic and will be available for artists and dancers.

## **SPRING CITY FACTS**

- 1852: Allred Settlement was established
- 1860: Orson Hyde arrives to take care of Sanpete affairs
- 1870: Spring City was incorporated as a town by legislative act, James A. Allred, first Mayor
- 1889: Spring City L.D.S. ward requested areas around city spring for a Baptismal font. This font was used for 25 years
- 1980: Spring City is on the Register National of **Historic Places**
- 2010: Forbes Magazine listed Spring City "America's Prettiest Town"
