OLD SCHOOL COMMUNITY CENTER DEDICATION

After forty years the Old School Community Center was dedicated on Friday, May 26, 2017. A **Wall of Honor**, composed of engraved plaques, is installed in the entry as a permanent show of gratitude to many of those who have made substantial contributions to the restoration of this grand building. The old school houses the city offices, the city council chambers, the court, and the DUP museum on the ground floor.

The second floor is a grand ballroom, rentable for private events such as weddings, family reunions and business meetings. There is office and business space available for rent.

The third floor, formerly an attic, is studio space for artists and dancers, and has also been used for events.

The Friends' future plans for the Old School are to erect a working flag pole, complete the restroom and install hardwood floors on the third floor, install gutters and downspouts and repoint the exterior brick and stone. There will also be a Veterans Memorial on the city lot, northeast of the building, near on the corner of 100 East and Center Street, built by members of the community and led by Courtney Syme and family.

FEATURED HOME



REDDICK NEWTON ALLRED HOME

This house is located at 115
South 100 East, Spring City, Utah.
Reddick Allred is one of the
original settlers of Spring City. This
house is a 1 ½ story oolite stone
house built in the 1870's. The
mason was a Dane, Jens "Rock"
Sorensen. In 1880. Isaac Allred
bought the home. Isaac was the
town druggist and a self-taught
dentist who would pull teeth if you
didn't care how much it hurt. The
house has been restored and is
owned by Sara Allred Watson.



REDDICK NEWTON ALLRED

Reddick N. Allred was born February 21, 1822, in Bedford County, Tennessee, the son of Isaac Allred and Mary Calvert. He had a twin brother Reddin Alexander, Reddick was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in 1833, and in 1840 moved to Nauvoo, Illinois. During the building of the Nauvoo Temple, Reddick served as a for the mason temple construction. He lived in Nauvoo until the Saints expulsion in 1846.



REDDICK AND LUCY ALLRED

Reddick married Lucy Hoyt in 1843. He enlisted in the Mormon Battalion and marched to California and back to Winter Quarters in 1846-1847. Reddick came to Utah in 1849 with the Allen Taylor Company. He was in charge of a company of 73 wagons and first lived in Salt Lake County.

In 1852-1855, Reddick filled a mission to the Sandwich Islands for the LDS Church. Upon his return he moved to Kaysville, Davis County, Utah. In 1856 Reddick went out to meet the belated handcart companies in Wyoming.

In 1857, Reddick married Amelia J. McPherson. In 1861, he married Celestia W. Warrick. He fathered 19 children.

In 1888, Reddick was indicted for polygamy under the Edmund-Tucker Law. To the indictment he pleaded guilty and was sentenced to 60 days in the Utah State Penitentiary and paid a \$50 fine.

During his lifetime Allred filled many positions. He served five terms in the Territorial Legislature, was a Justice of the Peace, Postmaster, and a member of the first City Council of Spring City.

Reddick Newton Allred died on October 10, 1905 in Chester, Utah. He is buried in the Spring City Cemetery.
