HERITAGE DAY



The Friends of Historic Spring City are pleased to announce our annual Spring City Heritage Day, on Saturday, May 26, 2018. This event includes a tour of many of the town's charming, mid-19th Century pioneer homes and buildings, including the Old Spring City School, which was restored and completed May of 2017.

HOME TOUR



Spring City leads the way in historic preservation and restoration in Utah. The town was designated a national historic district in the late 1970s, and since that official designation, over 50 of our local historical structures have been lovingly restored.

A silent auction ("Art Squared") will also be held at the Old School, where patrons bid on one-foot square paintings by well known Spring City artists, including Lee Bennion, Susan Gallacher, M'Lisa

Additional framed paintings by many of the participating artists are also available for purchase. Our annual antique sale will be held at the adjacent building to the east in the gym.
